

Physical Development (Prime Area)

Gross Motor Skills: PE: Gymnastics, games and dance GO (Get Outdoors) Learning every week Learning to climb over, under and through obstacles. Uses large construction to build. Fine motor skills - 'Funky Fingers', 'Dough Disco' Hold pencil effectively with comfortable grip and begin to form letters correctly.

How your child will be learning

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development. Children will mostly develop the 3 prime areas first.

The PRIME areas are: Communication and language; Physical development; and Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

These prime areas are those most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.



Literacv (Specific Area)

Write. Inc' Scheme. We will be learning to: Read all Set 1 sounds - speedily Blend sounds into words orally. Begin to spell words using 'Fred Fingers' Learning to read and write our names. Learning some high frequency (common) words.

independently using emergent writing to label and write captions.



Communication and Language (Prime Area)

Non Fiction Autumn texts and Poems Listen and respond to stories – recalling main events and role playing stories heard.

Develop their vocabulary – using words from topics and stories covered in class.

Personal, Social and Emotional **Development** (Prime Area)

As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas.

These SPECIFIC areas are: Literacy; Mathematics; Understanding the World; and Expressive Arts and Design.

We learn through asking and answering questions through enquiries and 'being'. For example, we might 'be' a mathematician, an athlete or an artist.

We encourage our children to talk about what they have 'been' during the school day rather than what they have 'learnt'.



We teach phonics following the 'Read,

Maths (Specific Area)

We believe in teaching our children 'mastery'. This means we want the children to gain a deep understanding of maths. We use NCETM 'Mastering Number', Numberblocks' and the Shape, Space and Measure parts of 'White Rose'.

This term we will learn about: The numbers 4 and 5 - composition and number bonds; Using the terms 'more than' and 'fewer than'; Triangles, quadrilaterals and pentagons

Understanding the World (Specific Area)

Expressive Arts and Design (Specific Area)
